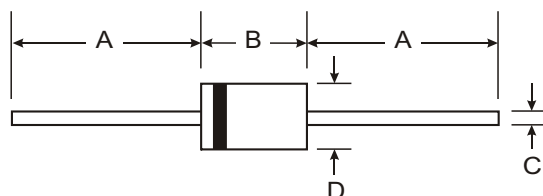
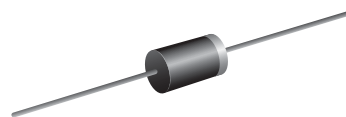

RATING AND CHARACTERISTIC CURVES UF300 THRU UF3010

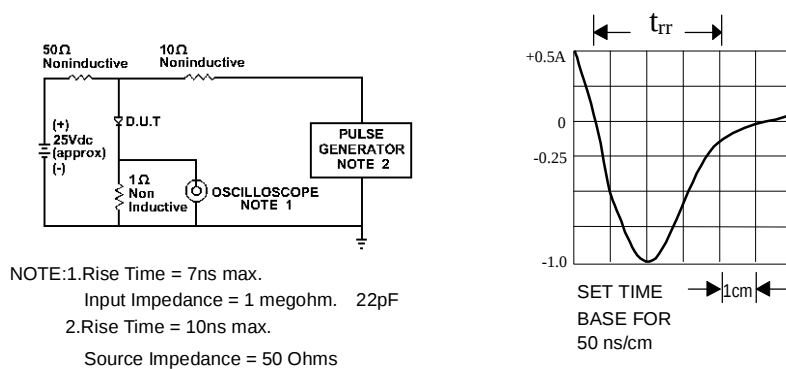


Fig. 1-REVERSE RECOVERY TIME CHARACTERISTIC AND TEST CIRCUIT DIAGRAM

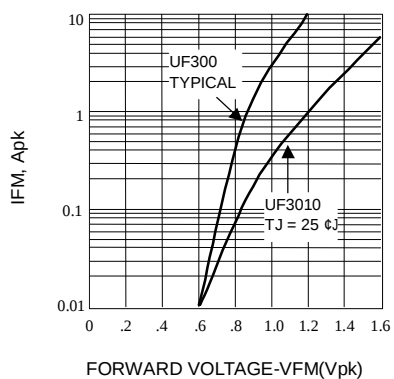


Fig. 2-FORWARD CHARACTERISTICS

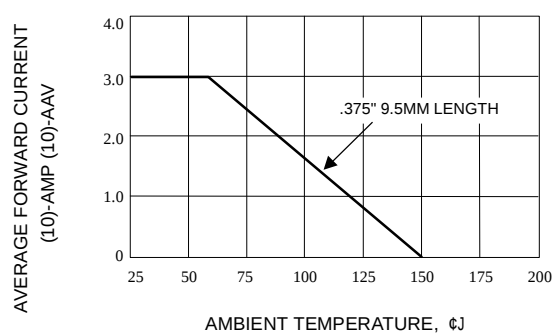


Fig. 3-FORWARD CURRENT DERATING CURVE

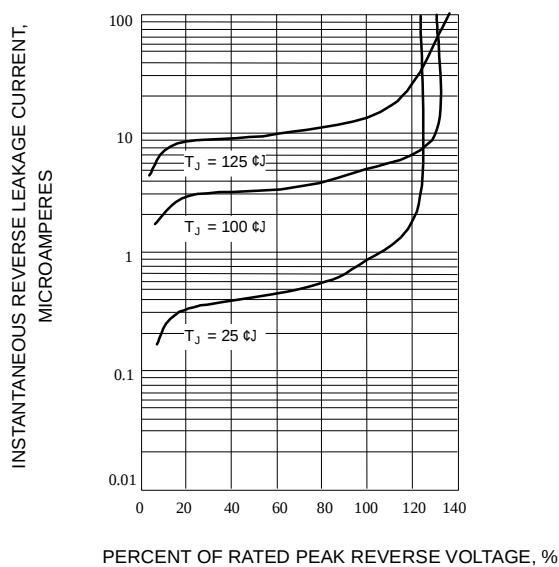


Fig. 4-TYPICAL REVERSE LEAKAGE CHARACTERISTICS

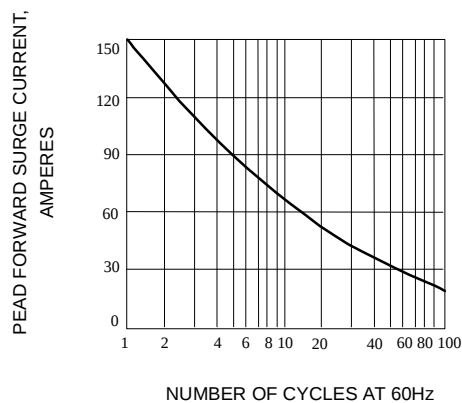


Fig. 5-PEAK FORWARD SURGE CURRENT
